Petition Filed by EDF to Ban Phthalates in Food Contact Applications

n April 12, the Food & Drug Administration (FDA), part of the US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), accepted a petition filed by the Environmental Defense Fund and supported by the Natural Resources Defense Council to "revoke and/or amend certain specified regulations....to no longer provide for the food contact use of 30 ortho-phalates, and, prohibit use of 8 specified ortho-phalates."

Industry responses to this "back-door" attempt at non-science based rule making will likely be handled through an industry coalition now being formed. This issue is of concern to manufacturers of PVC tubing, packaging, paper, paperboard, conveyor belts, sealing gaskets and film. Ironically, this petition comes on the heels of several recent reports in the media regarding elevated levels of phthalates in fast-food consumers and the connection of single-use PVC hospital equipment to post-ICU children that later develop ADHD.

Coalition of Vinyl Interests Launches Vinyl Verified

FVA has joined a consortium of vinyl industry organizations to create *Vinyl Verified*, a new effort that will challenge one-sided media coverage and misinformation in the public domain. The platform will confront media bias, alarmist commentary and competitive mischaracterizations about vinyl in the online discourse.

Exposing inaccuracies, omissions, flawed data and activist activity when it exists will be a central focus of this



new initiative. Vinyl is a high functional, versatile, durable, and economical material, however a select number of competitive interests and agenda-driven activists have advanced misinformed campaigns aimed at misleading consumers, denying them their rights to make decisions about vinyl with factual information.

The pattern of attacks on vinyl products has become harmful and at the expense of informed consumer choice. The *Vinyl Verified* effort will hold reporters accountable to their own journalism standards and identify groups that purposefully deceive the public.

California Proposition 65 Lawsuits Harming PVC Manufacturers Nationwide

California Proposition (Prop) 65 was passed into law in 1986 and requires product manufacturers, distributors, and formulators to provide "clear and reasonable" warnings on products sold in California that contain chemicals known to be carcinogenic, or to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm if exposure to those chemicals from the product exceeds the safe harbor level.

With the listing two years ago of a commonly-used phthalate, DINP, lawsuit activity by private plaintiff's attorneys has recently increased. Liability protection is currently available to industry supply chain organizations.

Unlike most other regulations which require the plaintiff to prove harm related to their claim, private citizens who sue are not required to do so. As such, most claims are filed by "bounty hunters." In these situations, if a lawsuit against a manufacturer or distributor is ruled in favor of the plaintiff, the result to the defendant organization can be costly settlement expenses that includes defense costs, plaintiff attorney fees, civil penalties and payments in lieu of civil penalties.

Specialized insurance coverage endorsed by SPI, the trade association of the Plastics Industry, will help companies protect their businesses.
